VENDOMOUS SNAKES of Florida

IMPORTANT

Most snake bites occur when people attempt to capture or hold a snake, or when they accidentally step on a resting snake.

Here are a few simple tips to avoid a bite:

- Never attempt to kill or capture a wild snake
- · Wear closed toe shoes when outdoors
- Teach children to avoid all snakes
- Learn to identify the venomous snakes in your area

E. DIAMONDBACK RATTLESNAKE

- Adults 4 6 ft., heavy body, triangular head
- · Repeating diamond pattern on back
- · Segmented rattles at end of tail
- Largest, most dangerous snake in U.S.
- Does not always rattle before striking







COTTONMOUTH/WATER MOCCASIN

- · Adults 2 4 ft., heavy body, triangular head
- Dark line runs from back of eye to rear of jaw
- Dull brownish black color as adult
- Body pattern of juveniles appear similar to Copperhead
- · Common in suburban areas, found near water
- Defensive attitude, able to bite under water







COPPERHEAD

- · Adults 2 3 ft., triangular head
- Golden brown color with light brown to grey crossbands
- Dark bands have hourglass shape
- Excellent camoflauge easy to step on
- Found only in limited areas of FL's panhandle

DUSKY PYGMY RATTLESNAKE

- Adults 1 2 ft., triangular head
- Grey body color with dark patches over red spinal stripe
- Tiny, barely audible rattles at end of tail
- Common in suburban areas
- Accounts for more snakebites in FL than any other species







EASTERN CORAL SNAKE

- Adults 1 2 ft., slender body
- · Brightly colored bands of black, yellow, and red
- Small, narrow head with black nose
- Venom is 3 times more toxic than a King Cobra
- Antivenom for Coral Snake bites is scarce







CANEBRAKE/TIMBER RATTLESNAKE

- · Adults 3 4 ft., triangular head
- Grey/brown to pink body color with dark crossbands; tail fades to near black
- Found in N. Florida, as far south as Gainesville
- C/T are same species, C is lowland & T is upland
- Extremely toxic venom that can be fatal
- Never touch, even if thought to be dead
